

The Bard ... but with a difference

Shakespeare, but with a musical twist, is set to be presented in Clitheroe.

To mark the 400th anniversary of Shakespeare's death in 1616, Clitheroe Parish Church Amateur Operatic and Dramatic Society with Stage Two, Downham, will be presenting "Broadway Bard".

Devised and written by Mel Morrow, it is a brand new musical show described as "Shakespeare does Show Tunes at Stratford-upon-Avon Street" and features songs from all your favourite musicals cleverly combined with excerpts from many of Shakespeare's plays and sonnets.

There will be a mixture of songs, dance, drama and comedy, with opportunity for solo, duet, quartets and chorus routines.

The directors are Anne Grogan and Fran Osborne with choreographer Lindsay Pollard and musical director Chris Andrews.
